- 4) Why does it matter? (v. 7): Christianity is a thinking man's game where we teach the next generation of the knowledge of God (Head), praying that God would impact their hearts (Heart) in conviction through the Holy Spirit, leading to biblical repentance, resulting in obedient lives and making disciples (Hands) All to the Glory of God.
  - A. How precisely and accurately can you communicate the glorious deeds of the Lord? Take time to list attributes of God or gospel doctrines and see if you can define them based on scripture. Who in your Lifegroup can you check your understanding with?
- 5) What example will they follow? (v. 8): This is not just to parents with children, but the whole church, to train the next generation. As every part of the body of Christ functions in unity, we are edified and built up together.
