The Omen of Absalom's Return

Main passage: 2 Samuel 13:34-14:33

Absalom's Retreat (2 Sam. 13:37-39)

[2 Sam. 3:2-5; 2 Sam. 5:10; Matt. 8:21-35]

• Instead of facing the sin and tension in the family, Absalom flees and David allows bitterness and aggression to fuel his attitude towards his son.

1) Absalom in Exile

A. Absalom allowed himself to toil over his sin of murdering his brother and ran from his problems. In what ways are you tempted to suppress conviction from the Holy Spirit and distract yourself from confronting your sin patterns?

Joab's Ruse (2 Sam.14:1-23)

[James 2:13; Romans 5:6-11; Eph. 4:17-19]

- Instead of speaking plainly to David, out of self-preservation, Joab creates this false story with this woman of Tekoa to gain an opportunity to convince David to reconcile with Absalom so that there is no more kingdom conflict.
- 1) Joab's politicking
- 2) Widow's wisdom
